

LEGAL NOTICE

STATE OF LOUISIANA, OFFICE OF CONSERVATION, BATON ROUGE, LOUISIANA.

In accordance with the laws of the State of Louisiana, and with particular reference to the provisions of Title 30 of Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, a public hearing will be held in the Hearing Room, 1st Floor, LaSalle Building, 617 North 3rd Street, Baton Rouge, Louisiana, at 9:00 a.m. on **TUESDAY, OCTOBER 5, 2010**, upon the application of **RDT PROPERTIES, INC.**

At such hearing the Commissioner of Conservation will consider evidence relative to the issuance of Orders pertaining to the following matters relating to the **Baker Lime, Reservoir A**, in the Grand Cane Field, DeSoto Parish, Louisiana.

1. To dissolve certain units previously created for the Baker Lime, Reservoir A by Office of Conservation Order No. 342-F, effective November 27, 1990, said units to be dissolved being shown on the plat submitted with the application and being designated BAK L RA SUA, BAK L RA SUB, BAK L RA SUC, BAK L RA SUD, BAK L RA SUE, BAK L RA SUF, BAK L RA SUG, BAK L RA SUH, BAK L RA SUL and BAK L RA SUK, and simultaneously therewith to establish rules and regulations and create a single reservoir wide unit for the exploration for and production of oil and gas from the Baker Lime, Reservoir A.
2. To force pool and integrate all separately owned tracts, mineral leases and other property interests within the proposed reservoir wide unit, with each tract sharing in unit production in the percentage shown on the plat submitted with the application for such tract on Exhibit A-1, which percentages have been calculated in accordance with the participation formula contained in the Unit Agreement.
3. To approve a pressure maintenance and secondary recovery program for the proposed reservoir wide unit employing the injection of gas, carbon dioxide, fresh water, salt water or other substances, all in accordance with the Unit Agreement.
4. To find that the proposed pressure maintenance and secondary recovery project is economically feasible, will appreciably increase the ultimate recovery of oil and gas from the Baker Lime, Reservoir A, and will prevent waste and the drilling of unnecessary wells.
5. To find that the Unit Agreement governing the plans and terms of operation of the proposed reservoir wide unit has been executed by at least 75% in interest of the Owners and Royalty Owners within the proposed reservoir wide unit, and to approve and adopt such agreement.
6. To designate Applicant as operator of the proposed reservoir wide unit.
7. To provide that all wells serving the reservoir wide unit should be exempt from the spacing provisions of LAC 43:XIX.1901 et seq. (Statewide Order No. 29-E).
8. To provide that the reservoir wide unit be granted a single oil allowable equal to the maximum efficient rate at which all wells serving the unit are capable of producing, which may be produced from any well or wells completed in the reservoir, at the option of the operator.
9. To consider such other matters as may be pertinent.

The Baker Lime, Reservoir A was defined in Order No. 342-F, effective November 27, 1990.

Plats are available for inspection in the Office of Conservation in **Baton Rouge** and **Shreveport**, Louisiana.
